

Archaeopteryx was a bird-like dinosaur that lived 150 million (example) years ago. Dinosaurs evolved into birds, and Archaeopteryx is often considered the most ⁽¹⁾ _____ of the stage when dinosaurs became birds.

Archaeopteryx was the size of a bird like a crow. It had ⁽²⁾ _____, broad wings, feathers and a long, bony tail. It was unlikely to be capable of full flight, ⁽³⁾ _____ it so closely related to birds today. Instead, it probably used its wings to help it travel further through the air ⁽⁴⁾ _____ from tree to tree.

Between the 19th century and early 21st century, Archaeopteryx was ⁽⁵⁾ _____ most experts to be the oldest known bird. Older examples ⁽⁶⁾ _____ been identified but Archaeopteryx remains the best known. This is mainly because of the excellent quality of a fossil which is now ⁽⁷⁾ _____ in a museum in Berlin. It was found in 1875 and its head, ⁽⁸⁾ _____ and wings are clearly visible.

Although twelve different fossils have been discovered, scientists are not certain that they are all the ⁽⁹⁾ _____ of species. We still know very little about this creature. Experts are continuing to learn about this link ⁽¹⁰⁾ _____ birds and these ancient dinosaurs.
